STEP UP AND STEP IN

In the 40 years since its founding, Yad Eliezer has refined the art of chesed so that it is effective, efficient, unobtrusive, respectful...and most of all, deeply kind. The way chesed should be.

ad Eliezer is famous for stepping up to the challenge of aiding Jews in Israel from all walks of life, from the cradle through old age. Just as impressive and important is the way Yad Eliezer steps into the lives of the needy. We look at the entire family situation, and come up with comprehensive solutions to difficult life challenges.

Our ultimate goal is always to enable our fellow Jews to live with dignity.

In the years since we began, Yad Eliezer and Israeli society as a whole have made great strides. But there are still many populations that need our help — especially large families, single parent homes and the elderly. Please read on to see how we have stepped up and stepped in to the challenges of 2019, and how you can step in to help us do more in 2020.

How does Yad Eliezer do it?

We step up to problems. Despite being a large organization, Yad Eliezer is nimble and always ready to step up and solve problems that we encounter in our line of *chesed* work. We continually evaluate the situation on the ground and ask ourselves what needs to be improved. And when

we see a need, we make every effort to address it. When families repeatedly turned to us for help to make weddings, we realized there was a broader societal problem that required our attention. Our solution? To create subsidized simcha halls — first in Jerusalem, then in Bnei Brak, followed by Ashdod and soon, Kiryat Sefer. These beautiful halls have not only made weddings more affordable for qualified families, they have also created competition in the wedding hall market and have forced many events halls around the country to lower their prices, which has benefited the general population as well. Nor did we stop there. Our newest innovation is our subsidized bridal salon on the premises of our Ashdod complex, which further alleviates the cost of weddings for disadvantaged families.

We step in to see the entire picture.

When a family turns to us for help, Yad Eliezer's staff ask specific questions: Do members of the household have sufficient food and clothing? What is the family's employment situation? How are rent, electricity and heating bills paid? Are there emotional problems that require attention? Our approach is to address the family's issues in an integrated way in order to guide our recipients to

greater financial independence and to help them break free of the cycle of poverty — not just in the near term, but permanently.

We step away from wasteful opera-

tions. Efficiency is one of the keys to Yad Eliezer's success and we attempt to maximize every dollar we raise. Our organization operates out of modest offices with a small staff and a large

volunteer corps. Advertising is kept to a minimum, and the scale of our operations enables us to acquire goods such as food products and winter blankets at a large discount. Our low overhead of only 3% means that when you donate to Yad Eliezer you can be sure that your donation is being used as effectively as possible towards alleviating poverty in Israel.

Our donors step up as well. The ongoing generosity of our supporters throughout the world is an integral part of our success. Your involvement and care throughout the years have enabled us to grow and establish vital new programs. You have also given us the impetus to be efficient and responsive. Your partnership makes this possible. We thank you for your ongoing trust and hope you will continue to see Yad Eliezer as your conduit for giving *tzedaka* in Eretz Yisrael.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS

In 2019, Yad Eliezer succeeded in stepping up support for several population groups whose need is great. Here are four programs that, thanks to the support of our donors, we were able to develop and expand this past year.

Bridal Salon

This initiative is another example of how Yad Eliezer steps in to fill the needs of the populations it serves. Several years ago, in response to increasing requests for aid in southern Israel, we created a complex of three all-new wedding halls in Ashdod called Ahuzat Friedman. These halls enable qualifying families to make beautiful weddings at subsidized costs. But we soon realized that providing a wedding hall was not enough the brides and their families needed help on other fronts as well. So to complement the extraordinary chesed work already being done at Ahuzat Friedman, Yad Eliezer founded an on-site bridal salon where needy brides can borrow quality wedding gowns to make them feel beautiful on their special day, and also receive a free dowry package of sheets, towels, pillows and



blankets with which they can joyfully start their new homes. That's Yad Eliezer: comprehensive assistance that changes lives.

Keren Almanos

This fund was established to help widows who are struggling to single-handedly raise their children while dealing with heartbreaking loss. In the past, the Keren Almanos worked hard to alleviate the material and emotional challenges these women face on a daily basis. In 2019 we stepped in further, adding several new projects that target sensitive times like weddings and holidays, when the lack of a spouse is felt most strongly.

Atara, a beautiful three-unit vacation complex in Tzfat available to families who could never otherwise afford a getaway. Qualified familes can reserve a Shabbat at Ahuzat Atara and take a break from their stressful daily grind. Careful planning and attention to detail go into every Yad Eliezer project and Ahuzat Atara is no different. Each of the three units includes a well-designed living area and dining room, a fully-equipped kitchen, bedrooms that can sleep a total of up to twelve, and even outdoor hammocks for relaxation. The psychological boost that this kind of weekend can give a mourning family is tremendous.



Other 2019 highlights of the Keren Almanos:

- Appliance packages distributed to children of almanos for their weddings
- A subsidized trip to Prague that enabled 147 almanos to connect with other women facing similar challenges to their own.

"This was the first time that I was able to take a vacation by myself. I only now understand how necessary it was for my neshama..."

• Modest holiday gifts, such as almost 800 sets of new towels for Sukkot and bracelets in honor of Pesach. The goal of these gifts is to

enhance the women's self-esteem and ability to make it through the holidays, even when they are overwhelmed by the need to do all the holiday preparations, handle all the extra expenses, be there for their children and then sit at the head of the holiday table alone.

Winter Warmth

In the past, this program focused on providing new, thick winter coats for young children. In 2019, in response to the need we were seeing, we added **3,000 stylish new women's coats**

to our distribution. The grateful reactions were unanimous. Here are some examples.

One teenage girl said, "This is the coat I've been dreaming of. I really wanted one just like this — it's stylish and so pretty, plus it's warm. I never believed that a dream like this could actually come true."

A mother helping her teenage daughter try on a coat began to cry and said, "You see? Now you have a new coat, too. And yours is just as beautiful as the ones your friends have."

"Up until now, our children walked

around wearing old, ratty coats. But now, these new ones have made them so happy (us too). You can tell there is joy in their hearts. They now have more confidence, which helps them at school and when they spend time with their friends."





end, they are unable to afford university tuition or find gainful employment, and they have limited options for the future.

Due to the many requests we've received for assistance with this phenomenon, in 2019 Yad Eliezer stepped in to provide support for an IDF-affiliated program that assists these soldiers in need. They are able to participate in courses that include training to become a Sofer Stam or

IDF lecturer, and they also receive career counseling and learn best practices for personal advancement.

The courses have a very high success rate. Soldiers have expressed their appreciation at receiving this support, and have conveyed how valuable and life changing they've been. Most participants have gone on to stable, successful jobs and are able to support themselves and their families respectably. Without Yad Eliezer, many of these young men would have become poverty statistics.

Post-Army Job Training

When IDF soldiers are in active service all their basic needs — food, clothing, a place to sleep — are met by the army. After service, soldiers who have the support of their families can move on to the next stages of life fairly easily — first university or other career training, and then starting jobs and families. But for soldiers who come from needy backgrounds, their release from the army is a precarious time: their daily support comes to an

Food Boxes



Stability. Normalcy.

The contents of the boxes — vital, healthy food staples and household essentials, are packed by our volunteers, keeping our costs low. And the relief that arrives on the doorstep with each package delivery — is invaluable.



Holiday Vouchers for IDF Soldiers



Food vouchers for deserving young men who have put their lives on the line for others — soldiers from

disadvantaged homes, "lone soldiers" who have

no family in Israel, married soldiers whose stipends are inadequate to support their families, and demobilized soldiers struggling to pursue an education and rejoin civilian life.



Feed a Baby for \$1 a Day



Baby formula for families in dire financial straits, in which the mother is sick, malnourished or other-

wise unable to nurse her child. Just \$1 a day can save a baby from malnourishment and the permanent damage this causes.





Y.I.K.G.H. Fund for Melamdim and Single Mothers

\$1,000,000 Distributed

Young Israel of Kew Gardens Hills works with Yad Eliezer to provide assistance to single mothers, as well as the families of *melamdim* living on very low incomes. The fund distributes food vouchers, clothing, shoes, school supplies and winter blankets. Without this assistance, these families would simply not be able to survive.



Oshrat O. lives with her husband and three children in Netivot. She suffers from illness, and her two older children have special needs. The expenses in Oshrat's home are numerous: in addition to daily expenses for basic necessities, she takes medications which are costly and her older children require therapies that run into thousands of shekels each month. Because of her condition, Oshrat is unable to hold down a job and her husband's income is minimal.

A friend of the family reached out to Yad Eliezer on their behalf, to ask for baby formula for the youngest child. With so many bills piling up, the friend was worried about the baby's nutritional needs. She saw the need in the home constantly growing and knew that Oshrat and her husband would be hard pressed to find the money necessary to purchase formula.

Yad Eliezer stepped up, supplying several months' worth of Materna as well as help for the holidays.

The family is working hard to deal with its many challenges but at least the baby is cared for, and Oshrat and her husband know that Yad Eliezer is always there to offer support and a helping hand should they need it.

The Holiday Fund

Attending to the emotional or psychological distress of a person in need can impact upon the entire family, and enable the family to transition from dysfunctional to successful. Big Brothers and Big Sisters

14,500+ Children

Mentors for disadvantaged children from families low on the socioeconomic scale, especially single parent families and homes in



which there is addiction or physical abuse. These children are at great risk for a range of emotional and behavioral disorders, and for criminal behavior, and mentoring can change their lives.

Winter Warmth Campaign

9,000 500 10,000 Coats Heaters Quilts

Winter coats, quilts and space heaters for the truly impoverished who sometimes have to choose between buying food or heat and warm clothing. A small donation can add a lot of warmth to the life of a struggling family.

Widows & Orphans Fund (Keren Almanos)

One of our largest programs, this fund provides monthly support for widows with children at home, based on a thorough assessment of their needs. In addition, the fund sometimes assists widows with one-time expenses such as urgent dental care, bar mitzvahs & weddings for their children, or medical treatment. Medical Support for Cancer Patients

Families

Severe illness can cause families to break down under the weight of their grief, anxiety and mounting debts. This fund extends a helping

hand during one of the most difficult experiences a family may face. It provides emotional and financial support for families with a relative hospitalized in oncology, hematology, bone marrow or immunotherapy departments. Yad Eliezer also provides patient advocates when needed, to liaison with doctors on behalf of the patient's family.

Job Training Fund

Young People

An investment in the future: tuition grants for young people struggling to acquire a profession in order to break out of the poverty cycle.

Shalhevet Early Learning Initiative

750 Children Professional detection and treatment of learning disabilities in the early childhood years, before they give way to serious behavioral, emotional

and educational problems. This program is vital to preventing vulnerable children from growing into at-risk youth, by getting them the help they need in time.



Emergency Fund

\$1,839,912 Distributed

This fund provides aid to vulnerable families who lack savings or relatives they can turn to. A one-time crisis like an expensive dental treatment or eviction notice can cause a downward spiral for these fami-



lies, but just a little support can save them from financial collapse.

Donor Advisory Program

This program exemplifies Yad Eliezer's invaluable partnerships with many of our involved, caring donors. Through our Donor Advisory Program, philanthropists recommend how to allocate their donations and Yad Eliezer investigates target recipients to determine their eligibility and ensure that donor funds support fitting recipients.



Meet Hodaya, a divorced single mother in Jerusalem struggling to raise her five children. She works full time but on her salary as a secretary she can't make ends meet, and at the end of every month she faces a mounting pile of unpaid bills. Every month she goes deeper and deeper into debt...and despair.

In an attempt to dig herself out of her difficult situation. ast year Hodaya began studying for a degree in counseling children at risk. This would enable her to switch her current job for one that would better support her family. Hodaya couldn't afford the tuition last year so she took out a loan which allowed her to get started. But this year she hasn't been able to find financial aid and now she is saddled with both tuition fees and loan payments. She is a good student who is motivated to finish her degree — her family's stability depends on it — but she almost quit recently. The stress of working, studying, raising five children and paying the bills was just too much.

This is where Vad Eliezer stepped in, with funding that allows Hodaya to continue her studies and eventually bring financial security to her and her children. In addition to financial aid, Vad Eliezer has provided mentors for Hodaya's children, to make sure they get the help and attention they need. Our goal is Hodaya's goal: to help her raise her children with dignity, become financially independent, and stop the cycle of poverty in its tracks, before it completely overwhelms this fragile family.

Microfinancing

Small grants (\$2500-\$8000) to help motivated individuals with solid business plans start a small business, or expand an existing one. The

individuals are carefully selected and mentored, and we believe that this program fulfills one of *tzedaka*'s ultimate goals, that of making the recipient financially independent.

Divorcees and Agunot

\$2,018,404 2000+ Families

The single-parent family faces more challenges than most. With the help of generous donors, this new fund provides monthly aid to qualifying parents for a limited amount of time until they can get back on their feet. By combining the monthly grants with job training, afternoon care for the children or other supportive programs, we can turn these families around and prevent children from becoming youth-at-risk. This fund is actively pulling the next generation out of the cycle of poverty and giving them a fresh start on life. Join us!


Sara L. endured multiple levels of trauma at a relatively young age. Her mother suffered from mental illness, and eventually abandoned Sara and her two siblings. Mrs. L. was admitted into a mental health facility, and her children have not heard from her since. Sara's father had died previously, so now she was essentially orphaned from both parents. Sara's older sister took responsibility for the family, looking after Sara's needs as best she could, but she herself was young and struggling financially.

When Sara got engaged. her happiness was tinged with worry and anxiety for both herself and her caretaker-sister: how could they possibly make a wedding without funds or parental help? Luckily, Sara heard from a friend about Ahuzat Friedman, Yad Eliezer's subsidized wedding hall. She more than qualified for assistance, and Yad Eliezer volunteers not only made arrangements for the wedding, we also helped Sara acquire essential household goods through our Kol Kallah Fund.

Sara says, "My situation was so bad and my expectations were so low that I wasn't sure I'd get married at all, never mind have a beautiful wedding, but thanks to Yad Eliezer that's exactly what happened. It's hard for me to express how much this meant to me and how grateful I am to be able to start my new married life on the right foot, with joy and hope instead of embarrassment and debt. My wedding was a true simcha and I hope that one day I'll have the means to help a young bride in a similar situation, and give back some of what I've received. Thank you, Yad Eliezer!"

Food Boxes

The Weisel family assembles tens of food packages for neighbors who are going hungry. The enterprise, in their home, is referred to as a balagan mesudar — an organized mess.

2019 Yad Eliezer allocates \$16,297,535 worth of food security to Israel's neediest citizens in the form of food vouchers in time for holiday celebrations, chicken for more than 500 families weekly for Shabbat, and food boxes for 5000+ families each month.

Feed A Baby

1989 30 families who can't afford baby formula are enrolled in this emergency program to prevent infant malnutrition. The program is initiated with the encouragement and approval of HaRay Gershonovitz z"l.

2019 Yad Eliezer supplies 2,000 babies every month with specially chosen formula

appropriate for each child's dietary needs, preserving their health while saving their parents the exorbitant cost.





Adopt a Wedding/Wedding Halls

Rebbetzin Weisel and volunteers help put together **several modest weddings** for poor *chattanim* and *kallot*. They cook homemade food in their own kitchens to serve at the *simchas*. They work with venue owners to get significant discounts when using their halls. They collect donations to help outfit the new couple so they look their best under the *chuppah*. Everything is done with a smile and with the utmost respect, to ensure that these men and women start their new lives with dignity.

2019 Yad Eliezer hosts 919 beautiful, cost effective weddings at our seven exquisite halls in Jerusalem, Bnei Brak and Ashdod. Brides make use of the services at our Salon Kallot (bridal salon) in Ashdod, 351 needy brides receive brand

new appliances through the Keren Yehudit Appliances program and 1200 are able to shop for new personal and home items through our Kol Kallah program.



Big Brothers and Sisters

1999 The program begins on a small scale in B'nei Brak and Jerusalem, to help 157 children from disadvantaged backgrounds and broken homes with educational and emotional support.

2019 14,670 boys and girls receive life-altering guidance from mentors who give of themselves at all hours of the day and night, throughout the year and throughout the country. **750 children with learning disabilities** benefit from remedial instruction and therapies implemented by educators of the Shalhevet program in numerous cities.

Widows and Orphans

2007 The inaugural year of the program, which is established to help widows-in-need provide for their families' most basic necessities. Yad Eliezer recognizes that the devastating loss of a beloved husband and father only compounds the tremendous stress, sorrow and anxiety in a needy home. Relief for household expenses is allocated to 175 almanos in Jerusalem and the center of the country.

2019 829 almanos and 5,637 orphans

throughout Israel are supported with crucial assistance that alleviates daily financial stresses and provides for extenuating circumstances and

celebrations. Funds are deposited directly into recipients' bank accounts to ensure privacy and respect dignity.



Job Training and Microfinancing

2012 Launch of the program, in line with one of Yad Eliezer's main directives: help people pull themselves out of the poverty cycle through job training and small business entrepreneurship. \$10,000 is allocated in funding to that end.

2019 Over \$140,000 provides tuition aid for 51 people completing coursework to acquire higher degrees, and supplies

small business grants to 60 recipients who are establishing new enterprises or upgrading already existing ones.




